## Women's Health Research: From Vision to Innovation

Carolyn M. Mazure, Ph.D. is a Professor of Psychiatry and the Associate Dean for Faculty Affairs at the Yale School of Medicine. She created and directs Yale's interdisciplinary research program on health and gender, *Women's Health Research at Yale*. Since its inception in 1998, *Women's Health Research at Yale* has initiated new studies designed to answer important health questions for women, built new research collaborations across the nation, and launched new investigators into careers dedicated to studying gender-specific aspects of health. Dr. Mazure's own research focuses on the interplay of stress, depression, and addictive disorders. Currently, she is the Scientific Director of Yale's NIH-funded Specialized Center of Research on gender-specific factors associated with stress and cocaine addiction, the PI for the Sex-Specific Factors Core of the NIH-funded Tobacco Research Center, and a PI within the NIH-funded Consortium on Stress, Self-Control and Addiction. Her published work includes books entitled *Does Stress Cause Psychiatric Illness?* and *Understanding Depression in Women: Applying Empirical Research to Practice and Policy*. Dr. Mazure has testified to Congress on the importance of women's health research, and has served as a Public Health Fellow on the Government Reform Committee of the U.S. House of Representatives.
