The Department of Health Sciences at Gettysburg College invites applications for a full-time tenure-track position in Public Health at the Assistant Professor level beginning August 2010. A doctoral degree is required. The successful candidate will be expected to teach in our rigorous health science-based undergraduate program, to supervise undergraduate research, and to maintain an active personal research program. Teaching responsibilities will include courses in the following areas: public health, global health, epidemiology with laboratory, and an additional course in area of expertise.
