Outcome evaluation investigates the Network's effect on short-term, intermediate, & long-term outcomes, as well as unintended consequences. Outcome measures move from proximal to distal & include, for example: 1) improved knowledge about prevention, risk reduction, screening, diagnosis, & end-of-life cancer services (e.g. short-term knowledge outcomes); 2) informed health decisions, increased provider-patient dialogue about screening (e.g. intermediate risk reduction & early detection outcomes); & 3) reduction in its incidence, illness, disability & mortality (e.g. long term morbidity & mortality outcomes).

Evaluation of *Riverside Prison Project*, in collaboration with Planned Parenthood Southeastern Pennsylvania (July 2008 - 2009). Served as evaluator of a sexuality education and life-skills program designed for women and teenage girls and housed at Philadelphia's Riverside Correctional Facility.
