Stanton B. Miller, MD, MPH is the Medical Director at Our Lady of Lourdes Medical Center in Camden, NJ where he incorporates the big picture of healthcare into his everyday work, advocating for patient rights and ensuring the quality of medical treatments. Dr. Miller is a 1980 graduate of the Jefferson Medical College. He completed a residency in General Surgery at Thomas Jefferson University Hospital in 1986 and then practiced in clinical surgery at Germantown Hospital and Jefferson Hospital until 2001. In 2002, he received the Master of Public Health degree from the John Hopkins University Bloomberg School of Public Health, where he also earned the designation of ‘Scholar’ at the Mid Atlantic Health Leadership Institute. Before coming to the Lourdes Health System he served as University Physician at Princeton University. Currently, Dr. Miller devotes time as a volunteer physician to the community-based Osborn Family Health Center, where he provides medical care to the uninsured residents of Camden County at Our Lady of Lourdes Medical Center.
